I refer to your LGOIMA request dated 14 March 2025 and provide the following response under each of your questions.

1) When did you build your first raised pedestrian crossing, and why? (As opposed to a standard zebra crossing)

The crossings were built for safety reasons with the first raised pedestrian crossing being built in 2017. The crossings close to schools were built to enable school children to get safely closer to the school gate.

2) How many have you built since?

We have built 28 raised pedestrian crossings, these are a mixture of full road zig zag and half road sharks teeth crossings.
