Legal Effect of Certain Rules in Plan Change 1 to the 2GP

The DCC gives notice for legal effect of certain rules in Plan Change 1 (Minor Improvements) to the Dunedin City Second Generation District Plan (2GP). This notice relates to changes to rules made under Plan Change 1 to the 2GP associated with stormwater open watercourses. These changes were considered at the Plan Change 1, Stage 2 (All Other Topics) hearing.

Section 86B(3)(a) of the Resource Management Act provides for rules that protect or relate to water to have immediate legal effect from the notification date of a proposed plan.

On 24 September 2024 the Council resolved to delay proposed changes to rules related to stormwater open watercourses from having immediate legal effect until the plan becomes operative. This decision was rescinded by the Council on 12 August 2025. Rule changes proposed under Plan Change 1 being addressed in Stage 2 (All Other Topics) will now have legal effect from the day decisions on submissions addressed in Stage 2 (All Other Topics) are notified, being today, Wednesday 29 October

Second Decision on Plan Change 1 to the 2GP

The DCC gives notice of the second decision on Plan Change 1 (Minor Improvements) to the Dunedin City Second Generation District Plan (2GP).

The Plan Change 1 Hearing Panel has issued its second decision report on matters considered at the Plan Change 1, Stage 2 (All Other Topics) hearing, which addressed submissions on all change proposals from Plan Change 1, except for Change SHB3 (Heritage), which was addressed in the first decision.

Status of 2GP

The changes to the 2GP made through the decision have 'legal effect' from today, meaning they apply in addition to existing 2GP rules. The changes will be 'deemed operative' when the appeal period has closed and no appeals have been received or appeals are resolved.

Appeals

Only submitters may appeal the decision and only in relation to matters in the original submission. Those that did not submit on Plan Change 1 cannot lodge an appeal. Individuals or organisations with an interest greater than the general public may be able to join an existing appeal.

The deadline for lodging an appeal is 30 working days from the date of notification being today, Wednesday 29 October, making Tuesday 9 December 2025 the deadline date (as defined under the Resource Management Act).
