My feed back on the proposed changes

Moving the pedestrian crossing due to infrastructure and safety improvements completed by Port Otago is disingenuous. There has not been an accident with the crossing as it is. But the new crossing looks like a runway to the new Port Otago Museum, to the detriment of parking for our wonderful library.

Why the lack/late Public consultation?
The Community Board, have to date not been involved.

What has happen to democracy that we can only have feed back on the parking?

Eleven car parks (restricted to P.30 and one mobility park is not enough to service the Town Hall, Library, P.O Museum and the large Blue Building (old Tunnel Hotel) which is up for sale.

The offer by Port Otago for additional public car park! Elderly people using the Library would have to cross one road no crossing (Mount Street) then 2 more pedestrian crossings (1 George St, 1 Grey Street) to get to the Library.

On Cruise Ship days this would be very stressful

The DCC could make all carparks for the Library, but I don't think this would be welcomed by the new Owners of the Blue building or Port Otago Museum.

Who will police the P30 carparks?

This proposed plan by the DCC does not serve the rate payers or users of our Library/Service Centre/I'site.
