Purpose of Today

- Ministry for Environment (MfE) is proposing changes to the Waste Minimisation Act 2008 and Litter Act 1979. This is currently open for public consultation.
- These are key Acts that the Waste and Environmental Solutions team operates under.
- The consultation period closed on 1 June. A draft has been submitted as a placeholder.
- **We seek your input** on the draft submission for the changes to legislation proposed by the MfE.





Background

- Ministry for Environment are proposing changes to key waste legislation
- The Otago Regional Waste Officer led the development of a draft regional submission with the Otago Waste Network.
- The submission reflects views of other Councils in Otago.





Current Situation

- Waste Minimisation Act 2008
 - Directs central and local government activity in waste minimisation.
 - How the waste disposal levy can be used and
 - Product stewardship
- Waste Disposal Levy
 - A charge for sending waste to landfill This is to disincentivise waste, and incentivise alternatives.
 - Waste Levy has been increasing and expanding since 2009, and is expected to increase to \$75 per tonne in 2027.
 - The levy is used for waste minimisation, as prescribed by the Waste Minimisation Act 2008.

Current Situation

Waste Minimisation Act 2008

- (1) The purpose of this Act is to encourage waste minimisation and a decrease in waste disposal in order to
 - a) protect the environment from harm; and
 - b) provide environmental, social, economic, and cultural benefits.
- (2) The purpose of Part 3 is, in addition to the purpose specified in subsection (1), to enable a levy to be imposed on waste disposed of to—
 - (a) raise revenue to fund—
 - the promotion and achievement of waste minimisation; and
 - activities that reduce environmental harm or increase environmental benefits; and
 - local authorities to manage emergency waste and to repair or replace waste management and minimisation infrastructure damaged by an emergency; and
 - the Ministry to undertake its functions and duties, and exercise its powers, in relation to waste management and minimisation and hazardous substances; and
 - projects that provide for the remediation of contaminated sites; and
 - increase the cost of waste disposal to recognise that disposal imposes costs on the environment, society, and the economy.





Current Situation

Litter Act 1997

- Gives the ability to infringe for offences of litter and illegal dumping.
- However, we can only enforce the infringements through prosecution.
 - Not allowed to use vehicle registrations as evidence.
 - An offender must be identified to prosecute.
 - Currently too resource intensive to gather the evidence sufficient to prosecute.
 - Scale of resourcing required is not proportionate to the scale of offences.
 Not practical.
- Addresses litter on private land, but only if it is 'likely to escape' onto public land.





Proposed Changes by MFE

- Creating a framework for extended producer responsibility
- Changes to how the waste levy is allocated to territorial authorities, and what they can spend the money on
- Clarifying roles and responsibilities for central government, local government and the waste sector
- Improving tools for compliance, monitoring, and enforcement
- Enabling efficient and effective controls for littering and other types of mismanaged waste.





Key Areas of Draft Submission

- Waste Minimisation Act 2008
 - Territorial Authority Waste Disposal Levy scope of use and distribution
 - Support changes in distribution but reservations about changes to scope of use.
 - Product stewardship/Environmental Producer Responsibility
 - Further considerations given in comments
 - Support combining the Litter Act 1979 with Waste Min. Act. 2008
 - Waste to Energy
 - Agree on applying waste levy to waste to energy, this form of disposal should be taxed. However, we don't want to normalize the activity.
- Litter Act 1979:
 - Tiered enforcement framework
 - Yes, support.
 - Ability to use surveillance powers and vehicle registrations for enforcing offences.
 - Yes, support.
- Regional Government role in waste
 - Seeks more clarity, responsibility, and resourcing for the role of regional government in mismanaged waste.

- Submit final version of submission to MFE on Friday 6 June.
- The final submission will be provided to Council in June as a note.
- Submissions will be analysed by MFE, then recommendations made to cabinet, then a bill will potentially be introduced to Parliament.
