| Celebrate Chinese New Year in Dunedin

The Chinese Cultural Festival is Dunedin's signature celebration of the Spring Festival (Chinese New Year) – a vibrant, family-friendly festival that honours tradition and celebrates the dynamic spirit of our city. At its heart is a major public celebration that draws more than 3,000 people into the city centre for fireworks, cultural performances, food, and festivity.

In 2025, the festival successfully expanded to a two-week programme. In 2026, we build on that success with an even more exciting citywide calendar of events. From Sunday 15 February to Tuesday 3 March, we invite performers, venues, tourism operators, stallholders, food vendors, businesses and cultural partners to express their interest in being part of this iconic celebration.

| Festival Overview

The Chinese Cultural Festival 2026 aligns with the Spring Festival (Chinese New Year) period, which runs from New Year's Day, Tuesday 17 February. To maximise community engagement, the festival begins before Chinese New Year opening with a city launch event on Sunday 15 February and concluding with a Lantern Festival celebration on Sunday 1 March.

Spanning two weeks, the festival will feature:

- Stage performances and traditional displays
- Cultural workshops and community-led activities
- Art installations, light activations, and pop-up events
- Dumpling tastings, calligraphy classes, and lantern making workshops
- Retail and hospitality collaborations.

The festival embraces diverse forms of participation, from intimate experiences to large-scale celebrations.

Festival Dates

Sunday 15 February - Tuesday 3 March 2026

The Dunedin Chinese Cultural Festival runs for two weeks, with public events and activities across the city.

Cultural Dates

Chinese New Year's Day Tuesday 17 February

The first day of the Year of the Horse, according to the traditional Chinese lunisolar calendar.

Festival Programme Highlights

Festival Launch Sunday 15 February

Opening celebration with live performances and media visibility. (Held ahead of the Chinese New Year's Day).

Chinese New Year's Celebration Saturday 21 February

Large-scale public event at Lan Yuan Chinese Garden with performances, family activities, food court, and fireworks. (Expected attendance: 3,000+)

Lantern Festival & Closing Celebration Sunday 1 March

A tranquil, family-friendly event with lantern workshops, tea ceremonies, and dumpling tastings.

Opportunities to get involved

Performers & Artists

- Perform on stage, as a roaming act, or at partner venues
- Deliver cultural workshops or creative demonstrations

Stallholders & Food Vendors

- Trade at the flagship event or other activations
- Offer themed menus or goods promoted through festival marketing

Venues

- Host cultural activities, talks, or performances
- Attract foot traffic and participate in coordinated festival marketing

Tourism Operators

- Create themed tours and experiences (e.g. food trails, heritage walks)
- Join the coordinated citywide programme and attract foot traffic

Local Businesses

- Offer themed promotions or in-store activations
- Decorate your space or windows in celebration

Activation Partners

- Install red lanterns, wishing trees, or public art trails
- Organise creative public experiences across the city
