PROCEDURAL MATTERS

- [1] A/Sgt Taylor-Harris formally requested a non-publication order relating to the identity of the patron involved in the incident at “DropKicks” on 3 April 2026.
- [2] The Chair acknowledged the request and moved the matter to a non-public hearing. The parents of the Applicant were given leave to remain as support persons for the Applicant.

INTRODUCTION

- [3] A request was received from the Chief Licensing Inspector requesting the Committee recall the issuing of the temporary authority issued to the Applicant for the premises known as “DropKicks”.
- [4] The Committee has the powers of a Commission of Inquiry. In addition to those powers, section 201(4) of the Act allows the Committee the power at any time, if it thinks fit, to rehear any matter that it has determined. In this matter, the incident referred to in the request was considered serious enough for the Committee to rehear the application to consider the suitability of the Applicant.

- [5] The Applicant company, Femme Enterprises Limited has a sole director and shareholder, Ms Rebecca Ellis. A temporary authority allowing her to operate the premises was issued on 11 February 2026 and is due to expire on 11 May 2026.
- [6] The Applicant also holds a temporary authority for another venue, “Errick’s”, but this temporary authority is not the subject of this hearing.

HEARING

Mr Stücki

- [7] Mr Stücki is present representing the Applicant.
- [8] At the commencement of the hearing a prepared statement for the Applicant was produced along with supporting evidence. The Applicant asked for the statement to be taken as read.
- [9] A short adjournment was taken to allow time for the Committee and the agencies to consider the statement.
- [10] The statement surrendered the temporary authorities for both “DropKicks” and “Errick’s” and for them to be surrendered immediately. The Applicant noted in the statement that a reason for the immediate surrender was that any new person interested in the business would need to apply for their own full licence and that no more temporary authorities could be issued.
- [11] The Committee explained that there were underlying licences held by Loboski Venues Limited for both premises and that they are currently undergoing the renewal process. This allows any new entity to apply for their own temporary authorities to enable them to trade while applications for substantive licences were submitted and determined.
- [12] The Committee had a brief adjournment to provide the Applicant with an opportunity to receive advice and to reconsider their position after the clarification as to the status of the premises was explained.

Ms Ellis

- [13] Ms Ellis is the sole director and shareholder of Femme Enterprises Limited.
- [14] After considering the legal status of the licence or any further temporary authorities, Ms Ellis said she still believed the surrender of the temporary authorities was the right thing to do and she wished to proceed on that basis.
- [15] The Committee acknowledged receipt of the surrender of the temporary authority.
- [16] That being the case, there was no longer any matter to heard so the Committee set aside the rehearing and the hearing was closed.
