- 2. Transpower is a person who made a submission about the subject matter of the proceedings (submissions 806 and 2453). The appeal points Transpower is joining concern the same topics and issues that are prevalent throughout its submissions.
- Transpower is also a person who has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the public generally for the reasons set out in its Appeal (ENV-2018-CHC-249) at paragraphs 5 to 10.
- Transpower is not a trade competitor for the purposes of 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991.
- Transpower is interested in the parts of the proceedings that may or will affect its ability to operate, maintain, develop and upgrade the National Grid, being those aspects of the appeal set out in **Appendix A**.
