Your feedback is important to us because it will shape how the coast will be looked after in the future. - "Beautiful accessible beaches which are safe and relatively quiet."
- "The long stretches of sand that provide a good space to walk and enjoy the sea air. I also enjoy the coffee shops at St Clair and swimming at the saltwater pool."
- "Best accessible coast line in NZ. I grew up in Dunedin (St Clair) and it was central point to meet and have fun. The sand dunes were well used as kids to play. Great surf!"

We will be posting paper versions of the survey to residential homes who live nearby the coast for those who do not have internet access.

During the lockdown we have been preparing some new ways for you to get involved.
