

Quick Brown Fox are responsible hosts and actively support the conditions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (2012)

As responsible hosts selling alcoholic beverages online QBF will:

Ensure prospective buyers and receivers of the products declare, by ticking an on-screen box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over. This will be presented upon entering the website, and also prior to the checkout, before the sale is completed.

Refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless, on both occasions, he or she declares that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, also declares that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over).

In the case of a telephone order:

The procedure is to ask the prospective buyer to declare, orally, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)—

- (i) once when the conversation concerned begins; and
- (ii) again, immediately before the conversation is completed; and refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless, on both occasions, he or she declares that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, also declares that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over).

In the case of an order made on a physical order form:

The procedure is to ensure that the form requires the prospective buyer to sign the form at a place at or near its end; and contains 2 requests for the prospective buyer to declare, by ticking a box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)—

one at the beginning of the form; and the other immediately before the place on the form where the prospective buyer is required to sign it; and refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless he or she has ticked both boxes and signed the form.

In the case of selling at events and expos whereby a Special Liquor License from the local authority must be granted.

- All staff are conversant with the requirements of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (2012), which prohibits any sale of liquor to minors (under 18's).
- Signage will be displayed appropriately behind the bar stating that minors will not be served. Anyone appearing under 25 may be asked to produce identification.
- Identification of the prescribed type (photo drivers licence, passport, 18 plus card) will be requested if any doubt as to age exists.

No sale will be made if inadequate identification is given, or if the buyer is under 18.

INTOXICATION

- All staff are aware that the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act prohibits any sale of liquor to INTOXICATED persons and that intoxicated persons may not remain on licensed premises.
- Signage will be displayed appropriately behind the bar stating that intoxicated persons will not be served.
- Staff have been instructed in how to recognise the signs of escalating intoxication.
- Any person displaying such signs will not be served any further liquor and may be asked to leave.
- Alternative drinks and food will be recommended when a person shows signs of escalating intoxication.

NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND LOW-ALCOHOL BEER

• Consider a range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low alcohol beverages be available. Tap water is provided free of charge.

SAFE TRANSPORT OPTIONS

- As responsible hosts QBF Drinks will ensure we have the ability to call a taxi if a someone requires safe transport options.
- The phone numbers of taxi companies will be displayed and promoted as a safe transport options.

LIQUOR PROMOTIONS

• No promotions that encourage the rapid consumption of liquor or an excessive volume of liquor will be initiated or carried out by any staff member.
