



Host Responsibility



We, the management and team at No8 Fine Spirits, want the premise to be a lovely place to be. We have a responsibility to provide an environment that is welcoming and where alcohol is served and consumed responsibly. Bearing this in mind, we apply the following policies towards consumption of alcohol on the premises:

We don't allow people to become intoxicated and shan't serve anyone who is noticeably so. If you're four sheets to the wind, we will ask you nicely to leave the premises and will encourage you to take a taxi or the newly available Uber.

It is against the law to serve alcohol to minors. If you look a day under 25 years old, wear trousers lower than your waistline, or turned up on an electric scooter, we will ask for proof of age. Acceptable forms of proof of age are a photo driver's licence, an 18+ Evidence of Age Card or a current passport.

We're lovers, not fighters. If anyone is aggressive, coercive, violent, or excessively sarcastic without decent enough humour to carry it off, they will be asked to leave the premises.

We have a range of tasty food always available. Menus are visible at all times.

We're not a boozer. Our drinks are chosen for their flavours and we've got some of the best premium spirits, some great craft beers, & wines. We provide 2 low alcohol beers (Steinlager Mid & Mac's Mid Vicious) and some great non-alcoholic drinks, such as juices, tonics, sodas juices. Drinking water is available free of charge at all times.

Walking's good for you, but if you're a bit worse for the weather, we'll call you a taxi to get you home safely.

We encourage groups of people to have a designated driver. Be nice to them. We do our bit by providing the low-alcohol and alcohol-free drinks listed above.

All of these services are well promoted, along with signage required under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

We train our serving staff to be responsible hosts and maintain strict adherence to this policy.

Please be our guest and enjoy yourself while at No8. We've got some great tipples to try and we want you to have a great time while we host you - and after you leave us. We pride ourselves on being responsible hosts. *

Noise

We will keep the noise level at a reasonable level. As a general rule, we want any music to be played at a level that allows for conversation between guests without them needing to raise their voices. We don't have the willingness to be open late at night.

Nuisance and vandalism

Our guests are a mix of old and young who are, generally, a respectable lot. The alcoholic drinks that we supply are the higher end, mostly being craft spirits, beers and wines. This excludes the riff-raff, rabble-rousers who prefer cheaper alternative intoxicating substances before setting off to cause mischief in the area. We encourage a responsible and mature culture of drinking at No8.

Our menu focus to serve good food for all diary (vegan and vegetarian options, gluten free),

The environment that we encourage through our choice of staff, music, food and drink is warm, friendly, creative and relaxed. We're just not that attractive to those people likely to cause a nuisance.

Many of our guests are tourist families and it's in our interest to deter intoxication and effectively manage anyone who is likely to cause trouble in our establishment or nearby.

We run an in-house training programme to educate all serving members of staff about the sale and consumption of alcohol. Everyone is taught whom to serve, how to recognise intoxication, and how to politely deflect or refuse service.

Surrounding residents and institutions

We operate in a manner that maintains a good relationship with all businesses and residents in our area. While there are few residents in the immediate area, there are a number of rented apartments, hotels and a good mix of retails. Shops around will provide good provision of parking facilities, traffic density and movements.

Early Childhood on Stafford is located at 650m of No8. While we do supply alcohol during the

day and night but we are a supervised area to be sure minors are accompanied by parents. Staff are trained not to serve minors, to request ID for anyone who looks under 25 years old, and to be wary of anyone who might buy alcohol to supply to minors.

St Matthew's Anglican Church is at 400m, Dunedin City New Life Church and Buddhist Centre at 500m from No8.
