Kia Ora

I refer to your requests regarding the See Saw in George Street and the local contractor.

To the best of our knowledge no member of the management team (we have taken this to mean the management team, as being the DCC Executive Leadership Team (ELT) and those involved in the project) is a relative of the contractor.

You have also asked a question in regards to local contractors. The Council's Procurement Policy has the following definition of what a local business means:

Local Business: a locally owned business or a corporate business with a local operation that provides goods, works, or services, based in the wider Dunedin territory. The Dunedin City Council acts as the territorial authority for Dunedin, which covers 3,340kms square kilometres from north of Waikouaiti to the Taieri River in the south and inland to Hyde, including 200km of coastline.

Based on the Procurement Policy, Isaac Construction is deemed as a local contractor because they are a corporate business with a local operation. The Council's procurement policy sets out the process for evaluating tenders and appointment of contracts. Any contract over \$100,000 must follow the following process:

"If it is an over \$100K procurement we start with the creation of a procurement plan detailing the scope, estimated cost, estimated contract value, evaluation criteria, evaluation team members, contract type, budget availability etc.

This gets submitted to our Tenders Board for approval. Once approved, tender documents will be uploaded to GETS and suppliers will have time to prepare a submission to try and win the contract.

Once the submissions are received, the evaluation team will evaluate and score the proposals. As part of the evaluation team we may invite suppliers to come and present to elaborate on their proposal (this was done for the Central City Upgrade) and the evaluation team then comes to together to discuss and possibly moderate their scores.

Once that is completed and a preferred supplier is found, a recommendation report will go to the Tenders Board detailing the submissions received and evaluation process and the report seeks approval to award the contract. Once approval is obtained, the contract is finalised and signed and work starts and the project is delivered "

Regarding your request for details of contracts given to local contractors and correspondence, this is declined pursuant to section 17(f) of LGOIMA because the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation or research.

As we have declined to provide some information you are advised that you have the right to seek a review by the Office of the Ombudsmen.
