#### Agreement

The parties identified below agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

#### 1 Parties

The Sovereign in right of New Zealand, acting by and through the Chief Executive of the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA)

**Dunedin City Council (Recipient)** 

National Infrastructure Funding and Financing Limited (Monitor)

### 2 Background

DIA, the Recipient and the Monitor are parties to a Funding Agreement dated 10 March 2023 as amended on 24 July 2023 under which DIA agreed to contribute Funding to the Recipient from the "better off" final support package and the Monitor undertakes a review and monitoring role on behalf of DIA (Funding Agreement).

The Parties have subsequently agreed to increase the amount of Funding under the Funding Agreement from \$9,876,000 to NZ\$11,540,000. The increased amount reflects the additional funding DIA has agreed to make available to the Recipient.

The parties have agreed to vary the Funding Agreement as set out in this Agreement, with effect from the date of execution of this Agreement by all parties.

### 3 Defined terms and interpretation

Except where the context requires otherwise:

- (a) in this Agreement, defined terms have the meanings given to them in the Funding Agreement; and
- (b) the provisions of the Funding Agreement relating to interpretation apply to this Agreement.
- 4 Confirmation of other terms

The parties confirm that in all other respects, the terms and conditions of the Funding Agreement remain in full force and effect but are extended to include the varied terms recorded in this Agreement.

## 5 Variation to the Funding Agreement

Each party agrees that the terms of the Funding Agreement will be varied as follows:

- (a) Clause 7 of Part 1 In paragraph one of clause 7 the reference to "NZ\$9,876,000" shall be deleted and replaced with "NZ\$11,540,000".
- (b) Schedule 1 The entirety of Schedule 1 shall be deleted and replaced with a new schedule 1 set out at the end of this document.

#### 6 Costs

Each party will pay its own costs of negotiating and documenting this Agreement.
