

GREEN ISLAND RUGBY FOOTBALL CLUB SUBMISSION TO THE DUNEDIN CITY COUNCIL 9 YEAR DRAFT ANNUAL PLAN 2025 – 2034

The Green Island Rugby Football Club (GIRFC) wish to submit their priorities and projects for consideration and inclusion into the Council's Annual Planning process. The GIRFC Management Committee have reviewed our planning arrangements and have identified the replacement of our field lights on Miller Park 3 and 4 with the financial assistance from the DCC as a priority.

Whilst we appreciate this is a 9-year draft plan, we urge the council to consider this replacement project to be of extreme urgency and consider replacement to be done during the summer months of 2025 – 2026.

Background

GIRFC is a non-profit incorporated society, and registered charity and is the largest rugby club by membership in the Otago and Southland region. As of April 2025, we have 565 registered players across 28 junior and senior teams, the majority of which require lights for training in the winter months. As only 2 of our 4 grounds are designated as training fields not only does this cause logistical issues but also significant safety issues due to the inadequate field lighting.

With 565 registered players, and hundreds more registered supporters and volunteers, this number would include a significant pool of DCC rate payers who are continually frustrated by the lack of co-operation and assistance from DCC personnel on this matter.

Health and Safety Concerns

Several occasions over recent years we have had players suffer injuries due to contact caused by players not being visible to each other to avoid unplanned and dangerous contact.

Obviously, the risk of injury to the 300 registered junior players is of a major concern to the GIRFC Management Committee. We can appreciate children play rugby for the enjoyment and are not yet developed to sustain the impact that can be caused from unintentional and accidental collisions on DCC owned fields.



These incidents have been brought to the attention of DCC personnel and Otago Rugby Football Union.

Loss of Revenue

In 2025 alone our club was scheduled to have 10 night home games (9 Friday night games for under 20 and under 21 grades and 1 premier game over the Easter break). All these games will need to be played at other venues resulting in the clubrooms not being open and vital revenue being lost. With the ever increasing cost of managing a sports club the lack of revenue is having a major impact of the GIRFC meeting these associated expenses. This occurred in 2024 and will continue to do so until the fields are match adequate.

Other Concerns

Particular frustration has risen from the assistance, either full or partial, given to other sports clubs/fields for replacement or upgrade of field lights and yet GIRFC (incidentally New Zealand Rugby Club of the Year for 2024) receive continual setbacks from the DCC saying there will be no funding assistance at all. The majority of those lighting projects that have received assistance would not have anywhere near the use required by Miller Park.

Conclusion

While the club will continue our own private fundraising for this project. We foresee the best case scenario being we reach our target in 2/3 years therefore prolonging the health and safety concerns, we implore the DCC to consider assisting the club as a future priority to ensure we can maintain our club membership.

On behalf of the Management Committee of the GIRFC we thank the DCC for its consideration of our submission.



- Numerous times, we have reached out to the Dunedin City Council, who we lease four rugby fields annually, for financial assistance to upgrade our outdated and unsafe field lighting on fields three and four. But we were declined due to budget constraints. While other grounds in Dunedin have received upgrades despite being used less.
- We continue to face health and safety risks for players, including 300+ children and 200+ senior players who train nightly during the week.

New lights on fields three and four are a game changer for our community.


- Safety First: Right now, the poor lighting is causing collisions and injuries. Better lights mean safer games and training sessions for everyone out there




