TABLE 2: Rural Zone New Sites Created 2001-2012



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

## **DRAINAGE ISSUE 103 MAIN SOUTH ROAD**

I am writing to you with regards to a drainage problem at 103 Main South Rd, East Taieri. The customer has an on-going problem with seepage through the slope into her garden. Having visited site and discussed the problem with the customer the water originates from a cut-off drain that runs parallel to her rear boundary and drains water from the hillside to Riccarton Road East.



It appears that the cut-off drain was probably originally dug in around the 1950's. There is a natural depression immediately behind the property at number 103 and there is an overflow pipe to convey excess water through number 103.

Based on the customer's reports, the section of the land drain immediately behind her property was deepened in late 2006/2007. She presumes this was done by the adjacent landowner in conjunction with some fencing work. Unfortunately, this now means that there water now pools in the deepened area behind her property rather than continuing along to Riccarton Road East. There is some vegetation in the ditch behind number 99 Riccarton Rd that the customer has expressed concerns about. However, following inspection on site it is clear that the water would not be able to flow to the vegetated area due to the over deepening.

The customer understands that she is obliged to accept naturally occurring water originating from higher ground. However, the land drain effectively concentrates the naturally occurring water, resulting in overtopping in a concentrated area and the over-deepening causes the additional water to accumulate immediately above this particular property causing seepage.

I have concluded this matter concerns the diversion of water, and is unrelated to Civic infrastructure. Having consulted with the DCC's Legal Counsel, Dunedin City Council does not have any powers to address the diversion of water. I am therefore referring the matter to the Regional Council for consideration under the Regional Water Plan, in particular rule 12.3.2.2.
