NOTICE BY THE OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL OF ITS WISH TO BE A PARTY TO PROCEEDING

- The OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL wishes to be a party to the following proceedings:
 - 1.1. the appeal by DDS Properties (2008) Limited dated 17 March 2023 being ENV-2023-CHC-019 from the Dunedin City Council's ("DCC") decisions on Variation 2 to its proposed Dunedin City District Plan ("2GP").
- 2. The OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL is:
 - 2.1. a local authority; and
 - 2.2. a person who made a submission about the subject matter of this proceeding.
- 3. The **OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL** is not a trade competitor for the purposes of section 308C or 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991 ("the Act").
- 4. The OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL is interested in all of the proceedings.
- 5. Without derogating from Paragraph 4, the **OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL** is interested in the following particular issues:
 - 5.1. expansion of the Allanton township into rural zones;
 - 5.2. the protection of high-class soils;
 - 5.3. stormwater management;
 - 5.4. wastewater management;
 - 5.5. access;
 - 5.6. transport;
 - 5.7. susceptibility of at least part of the site to flooding;

- 5.8. potential effects of climate change;
- 5.9. the protection of indigenous biodiversity;
- 5.10. the implications of natural hazards including ground instability and liquefaction; and
- 5.11. potential effects on infrastructure including Otago Regional Council drains and flood protection schemes.
- 6. The **OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL** opposes the relief sought because:
 - 6.1. the relief is not a strategic and coordinated form of urban growth and development;
 - 6.2. the relief will result in adverse effects on rural landscape and amenities:
 - 6.3. the relief does not constitute well designed urban growth and development;
 - 6.4. access and other transport issues have not been adequately addressed by the Appellant;
 - 6.5. the relief will result in undesirable urban style sprawl with sporadic development of residential and associated activities in a rural setting;
 - 6.6. the relief will result in the loss of highly productive land and diminish rural productivity;
 - 6.7. the appeal site is affected by natural hazards including flooding, ground instability and liquefaction;
 - 6.8. the relief does not have regard to the effects of climate change;
 - 6.9. the relief will have adverse effects on the receiving environment;
 - 6.10. there is potential for adverse effects from stormwater and wastewater discharges on the receiving environment;
 - 6.11. the adverse effects on the receiving environment include adverse effects on Otago Regional Council drainage and flood protection assets and their effective management;

- 6.12. the relief sought will have adverse effects on indigenous biodiversity;
- 6.13. the relief does not give effect to and is not needed to give effect to the National Policy Statement on Urban Development;
- 6.14. the relief is contrary to and does not give effect to the National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land;
- 6.15. the relief does not give effect to the National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management;
- 6.16. the relief does not give effect to the partially operative Regional Policy Statement 2019 and does not have regard to the proposed Otago Regional Policy Statement 2021;
- 6.17. the relief does not give effect to the strategic objectives and strategic policies of 2GP;
- 6.18. the relief will result in unacceptable effects on the environment; and
- 6.19. the relief does not promote sustainable management and is contrary to Part 2 of the Act.
- The OTAGO REGIONAL COUNCIL agrees to participate in mediation or any other alternative dispute resolution of the proceedings.
