Install basketball hoops at four playgrounds across the city

Improve playgrounds in South Dunedin, Karitane and Caversham

Replace old playground equipment in Sawyers Bay, Maori Hill, Calton Hill, Roslyn, Kaikorai, Concord and Musselburgh

WHAT'S IN THE PLAN FOR 2022-24

Renewing the surfaces at Mornington and Thomas Burns Skateparks

Upgrading Woodhaugh Gardens playground, to include new equipment and options for a new paddling pool or splash pad

New pump track/s across the city

Playground renewals and improvements – replacing and providing new equipment at playgrounds across the city
