Need for renewal

The wider central city area was described as:

- dull, poorly maintained
- car dominated with associated pedestrian safety and accessibility issues.

Provide for pedestrians

- improve accessibility
- lower speed limits
- use shared spaces or exclude motor vehicles (notably buses).

Art, aesthetics and greenery

- provide seating and shade
- provide more greenery through plantings, trees and pocket parks.
