

SUMMARY

This paper outlines the process Dunedin City Holdings Ltd (DCHL) has followed to appoint three new directors, and re-appoint four existing directors, to DCHL group companies.

The appointments and re-appointments are presented to Council for noting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Dunedin City Holdings Ltd (DCHL) recommends that the Council **notes**:
 - the appointment of Janice Fredric to the board of Aurora Energy Ltd, for a term of two years and eight months commencing 1 July 2022;
 - the appointment of **Peter Carnahan** to the board of Delta Utility Services Ltd, for a term of three years commencing 1 August 2022, and to Chair the company from 16 October 2022;
 - the appointment of **Kate Bromfield** to the board of City Forests Ltd, for a term of two years commencing 1 September 2022;
 - the re-appointment of Scott Mason to the board of City Forests Ltd, for a threeyear term commencing 1 October 2022; and to Chair the company from 1 September 2022
 - the re-appointment of **Steve Thompson** as the Chair of Aurora Energy Ltd, for a three-year term commencing 1 June 2022;
 - the re-appointment of William Cockerill as the Chair of Dunedin Stadium Property Ltd, for a three-year term commencing 1 June 2022; and
 - g) the re-appointment of Adam La Hood to the board of Dunedin Venues Management Ltd, for a three-year term commencing 27 August 2022.

BACKGROUND

2 The Dunedin City Holdings Ltd (DCHL) board holds responsibility for appointing directors to its subsidiary and associate companies.

DISCUSSION

New appointments

- 4 The following vacancies arose at DCHL group companies this year:
 - A director vacancy at Aurora Energy Ltd (Aurora Energy), following the resignation of current director Margaret Devlin
 - A Chair vacancy at Delta Utility Services Ltd (Delta), as current Chair Brian Wood has reached the maximum nine years' service within the DCHL Group;
 - A director vacancy at City Forests Ltd (City Forests), as current director Tim Mepham has reached the maximum nine years' service within the DCHL Group.
- Open application processes were held for these roles in April / May. The table below sets out some data relating to those processes:

Shortlisted candidates were interviewed by a panel comprising the DCHL Chair Keith Cooper, another DCHL director Susie Johnstone, and the Chair of the relevant company, assisted by Stimulus Consulting. The DCHL Chair and DCHL director then made recommendations to the DCHL board who made the appointment decisions.





Re-appointments and transitions

9 Four re-appointments have also been made across the DCHL Group for the 2022 calendar year. The DCHL board has resolved to re-appoint:

- 10 DCHL considered each potential re-appointment with regard to the following factors, in accordance with policy:
 - a) number of years served;
 - performance of the director and the needs of the board as a whole (including results of recent director or board performance evaluations);
 - c) consultation with the Chair of the board (where applicable);
 - d) whether the skills of the director add value to the work of the board;
 - e) whether there are other skills which the board needs;
 - f) whether the director is a potential candidate for future Chair;
 - g) whether the process offers an opportunity for increasing board diversity;
 - h) succession planning; and
 - i) whether knowledge of tikanga Māori may be relevant to the governance of the company.

City Forests Ltd Chair transition

- 11 In October 2021 Council approved the re-appointment of John Gallaher as Chair of City Forests.
- Mr Gallaher's re-appointment was proposed on the basis that Mr Gallaher would work with the DCHL board to identify the skillsets required and agree a replacement Chair and transition programme.
- 13 This has now been completed, and the DCHL board has appointed existing director Scott Mason to take over as Chair from 1 September. Mr Gallaher will remain a director of the company to allow a smooth transition before he retires from the company on 31 October.
- 14 Following the retirements of Mr Gallaher and Mr Mepham the City Forests board will return to its usual state of four directors.

NEXT STEPS

15 DCHL will provide a further update to Council on other DCHL Group appointments / reappointments later in the calendar year.
