#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Likely built in 1882 for grocer and local body politician Edgar Scott Clarke, this wedge-shaped stone former store and residence has historical, aesthetic, and architectural significance. Likely built of local stone, this is a prominent building in the suburb of Woodhaugh. The store was associated with the community that grew up around the industries that were established close to the Water of Leith, the store was a postal agency, telephone bureau, and a place from which important information was disseminated. Operating for over 60 years, the former Woodhaugh Store recalls the history and development of this Dunedin suburb.

The store is comparable to scheduled heritage buildings within Dunedin of a similar type and period. When compared with other scheduled buildings, it meets the threshold to be included on the district plan heritage schedule.

#### Previous site development

Woodhaugh Valley, with the Water of Leith running through it, was the site of early industry. Edward McGlashan's flour mill was erected there in the mid-1850s, taken over by Rennie and Macgregor by the close of the 1860s. A bone mill also operated there, taking advantage of the water supply. In 1875, Edward McGlashan erected the Woodhaugh Paper Works close to the Water of Leith on the site of an old sawmill – recycling rags, rope, old paper, and rope into paper. A community grew up around these industries. The paper works were across the road from the subject site.

This subject land was first granted to John McGlashan in 1860. McGlashan owned a large block of land in what was then known as 'McGlashan's Valley': thirty-four quarter acre sections were offered for sale in December 1874. A store at Woodhaugh was operating in the 1870s. In the late 1870s the subject section was transferred from Edward McGlashan to hotelkeeper Adam Anderson. In 1882, Anderson sold the property to grocer Edgar Scott Clark. Clark took out a mortgage the following year. Part of the land was declared road and a new title issued in 1907.

#### Design and construction

In September 1882, Clarke invited tenders for the erection of a 'stone house or store.' This is likely the subject building. It is not known who designed or built the store. The 1883-1884 *Wises' Directory* records Clarke as an agent and grocer. The 1890 Electoral Roll describes Clarke as a Woodhaugh storekeeper. A photograph taken before the Woodhaugh Paper Mill burnt down in 1900 shows the distinctive wedge-shaped store. Woodhaugh Store served as a grocery shop, postal agency, and a place where locals could view important information such as tender documents for public works and electoral material.<sup>1</sup>

The subject building single storey, built of shaped stone brought to course with contrasting quoins. It is likely that this stone was quarried locally. It is wedge-shaped in plan, aligned with the Woodhaugh-Malvern Street corner section. Its main entrance is on the Woodhaugh corner (north elevation), with a central door with fanlight above, flanked by two large timber framed windows with arched timber joinery that follows the flat profile of the openings. The timber window joinery on the north and east elevations is a later alteration, historic photographs showing the original timber joinery from when the building was a store. The roof form is a pair of hipped gables with a central valley. On the west elevation the original double hung sash window remains, but what was a door has been closed. The south elevation retains the original window layout and likely some of the original timber window joinery.

#### **Later Development**

DCC drainage records show a connection in 1914, although it is clear this postdates the building's construction. In 1918, Clarke offered 'Woodhaugh Store and Telephone Bureau' were to let, noting that the store had been established for 40 years. The store operated at least until the mid-1940s.

By the end of the 1910s, Clarke and his family are recorded as living in 'Clarewood' on Clarewood Street, nearby across the Water of Leith. Clark died in 1941. It remained in the family until the late 1950s, after which the property was subdivided and sold. The property has changed hands several times since then.

#### **Notable People/Themes**

Edgar Scott Clarke (1851-1941) was a Dunedin storekeeper, public servant, and local body politician. He was Māori Hill Borough Council Inspector of Nuisances in the late 1880s, the Returning Officer, and appointed as a Justice of the Peace in 1901. He was elected as councillor for the East Ward of Māori Hill Borough Council in 1911. He was elected Mayor in 1914. He was proprietor of Woodhaugh Store for over 40 years.

### ASSESSMENT OF HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

# HISTORIC/SOCIAL

The building demonstrates heritage values within this criterion. The former Woodhaugh Store, likely built c.1882, represents the early history of the suburb of Woodhaugh that grew up around the local industries. The store was owned and run by Edgar Scott Clarke for over 40 years. Clarke was a businessman, civil servant, and local body politician for the Māori Hill Borough Council — long active in the borough's affairs. The store itself provided groceries, postal and telephone services, and acted as a place from which to disseminate important information. Along with the Category 2 listed former Woodhaugh Hotel, it formed the nucleus of this community.

### SPIRITUAL/CULTURAL

The building does not demonstrate heritage values within this criterion.

#### **DESIGN**

The building demonstrates heritage values within this criterion. This wedge-shaped stone building of a vernacular Victorian style has aesthetic and architectural significance. It's distinctive shape and likely use of local stone have made it a landmark in Woodhaugh.

# TECHNOLOGICAL/SCIENTIFIC

The building does not demonstrate heritage values within this criterion.
