Notice of Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu Withdrawing Section 274 Interests

Dated: 19 November 2020

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May it please the Court:

1. We act for Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu (**Te Rūnanga**) in relation to their appeal on the Dunedin Second Generation District Plan (**Proposed Plan**) (ENV-2018-CHC-256) and their section 274 interests in Proposed Plan appeals ENV-2018-CHC-249 and ENV-2018-CHC-277.
2. Te Rūnanga gives notice that it wishes to withdraw aspects of its section 274 interests under the Public Health and Safety topic that is scheduled for its second round of mediation (as part of the Network Utilities mediation) on 23 – 26 November 2020.
3. In particular, Te Rūnanga gives notice that it wishes to withdraw from the relief allocated to the following ‘issue-based topics’ detailed in the mediation notice:
 - (a) *Deletion of electrical interference provisions:* Transpower New Zealand Limited’s appeal point #141 relating to Policy 9.2.2.12, Rules 9.3.2 and 9.5.3.5 and the rules in the management zone sections of the Plan that cross-reference to electrical interference rules in Section 9; and
 - (b) *Noise from temporary generators:* Aurora Energy Limited’s appeal point #244 relating to Rule 9.3.6 seeking amendment to exempt noise generated by temporary or standby generators.
4. Te Rūnanga no longer has an interest in these points and therefore seeks to withdraw its interest.
