Can I please get clarity around the road works on Rattray Street.

Over the last week I have received multiple complaints around the inner city.

On Tuesday we had multiple roads closed causing quite a bit of chaos sending lots of people up through Maori Road when they were only trying to travel a short journey across town. For example to go from the council car park across to the Scenic Cirles hotel I had to travel via Maori Road also.

The key issue seems to the work around Rattray Street. But on Tuesday both Moray Place (between upper Stuart & Princes Street) and George Street (between Moray Pl and Bath Street).

How long has Rattray Street been closed? (I understand this isn't DCC and understand it is related to an electrical connection)

Was this known to staff that this work would take so long?

What work is being done?

Why are the contractors only working single shift?

Why is so much of Rattray Street closed off? (from Princes Street around and up to Otago Girls with the turn off down Dowling Street also closed).

Is council managing the impact of this closure and traffic issues around the city relating to this street work being done?

I look forward to getting a greater understanding of what is happening and I believe some public communication needs to be put out. I can imagine this is going to be a nightmare tomorrow with the school commute.
