Subject: Parking machines

Afternoon,

I'm compiling a story to be published over summer on parking machines/meters.

Are you able to provide the following under the Official Information Act?

1. How much has the council earned from parking machines/meters the last financial year?

Revenue from on street and off street parking meters for 2015/16 was \$4,266,700. Revenue from parking machines in DCC parking buildings was \$688,000. Please note these figures do not take into account the cost of providing parking services.

2. Was this ahead of budget?

No, this was \$32,000 less than budgeted.

3. Can you provide a breakdown of payment for parking, ie coins, cards, text a park? Meters (on and off street) - cash 76%, txt a park 6%, credit/debit card 18%.

Parking buildings - cash - 56% credit/debit/eftpos 44%.

- 4. How many machines do you operate? Seven car park building pay machines, 343 pay and display machines.
- 5. Are you able to reveal which machine, or street, earned the most \$\$\$? Machines in car parks earn the most revenue. In terms of on street parking, the parks in the centre of the Octagon earn the most revenue.
- 6. Can you say where the cheapest park is, and the most expensive? Prices are available on our website http://www.dunedin.govt.nz/services/parking/where-you-can-park.
- 7. Anything else you would like to add?

You might be interested to know the DCC owns about 2500 on street car parks.
