Thanks for your early reply

Dunedin City Council offers a free service to people who are asking questions like yours. You need to come to the council reception area in the Civic Centre, George Street, during business hours, and ask to speak to the duty planner. There may be a short wait if the planner is with someone else. The planner will know the rules related to commercial activity and will be able to advise you on council's requirements, including signs. For information about your tax/IRD responsibilities I suggest you speak to an accountant or contact Inland Revenue.

You are also welcome to phone the main council number and ask to speak with the duty planner at any time. Good luck with your business idea.
