I would like to get an idea of what appears to be an expansion of the comms department, so would like to find out:

- -Budgets for the department over the last five years.
- -Staff numbers for the department over the last five years.

The budgets for the past five years for the Council Communications and Marketing Department are:

These Department costs include the Communications team, the Web Services team and the Marketing Design team. The increased costs reflect more staff taking up Kiwisaver, adjustments for inflation as well as an increase in staff numbers from 14.53 FTEs in 2013/14 to 15.43 FTEs in the 2017/18 financial year. However at the moment we are working below that capacity with two positions vacant. One of these is a 1.0 FTE with the Web Services Team and the other a 0.5 FTE with Marketing Design. Both of these vacancies will be advertised later this year.

Within the Department, the budgets for the past five years for the Communications team are:

These figures include staff costs and other operational costs such as the printing and distribution of *FYI Dunedin*. Over the five years, the Communications team has risen from two FTEs to three FTEs. This reflects an increased workload in key areas such as digital and social media and media enquiries, and the DCC's efforts to improve the way it communicates with its residents. An extra staff member also means the organisation is better placed to get information out quickly to the public in emergencies. Staff costs have not been separated out in this area of the response as it would potentially identify individual remuneration.

Because of the significant number of large infrastructure projects underway or in planning, we also have a Communications Advisor in a two year contracted role. This cost is met from infrastructure budgets.
