I refer to your e-mail of 15 October 2024 and apologise for the delay. Please find our response below.

- The district plan does not include any rules/policies/objectives that are specifically designed to avoid adverse effects of dog attacks and vehicle strike on penguins
- There is a large amount of documentation that underpins the making of the district plan. We are providing links to the material considered to be most relevant, which includes the section 32 reports and hearing panel decisions for the development of the 2GP as detailed below. There have been two variations to the District Plan since this time, however neither of these variations were relevant to the NZCPS.

The Council has just completed hearings on the review of the Dog Control Bylaw and Dog Control Policy. The recommendations will be considered at the Council meeting on 25 November. This shows areas where dogs may be on and off leash in certain areas and beaches in the city.

Your request to provide Reports received by the Council on dog attacks and vehicle strikes

on penguins in the last 3 years, is declined pursuant to section 7(2)(f) of LGOIMA due to substantial collation as it would require the Council to look at each individual complaint to determine the nature of the incident.

The Council does not undertake monitoring of penguin populations, this is managed by the Department of Conservation.

As we have declined to provide some information you are advised that you have the right to seek a review by the Office of the Ombudsman.
