Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA) request for information on Warrington and Thomas Burns freedom camping sites

I am writing in response to your request made on 24 May 2019 for information on the availability of spaces at the Warrington and Thomas Burns trial for the date in question (Sunday, 17 March 2019 03:01:00 a.m.).

The Dunedin City Council's contracted security company makes nightly visits to freedom camping sites across the city. The times of visits vary slightly each night, and so we cannot confirm how many spaces were utilised on either site at exactly 03:01:00am on the morning of Sunday 17 March 2019. However, we can give data collected by security for those sites on that evening as follows:

- Warrington – 45 vehicles, and multiple free spaces (note – as the Warrington site covers the hard stand car park and grassed reserve area, there is no identified number of spaces available. However, this site can accommodate up to 150 vehicles)
- Thomas Burns – 51 vehicles, and 14 free spaces

I trust this answers your request.
