Sections 14 to 16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

**PURSUANT** to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, Quencel's Limited is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 41 George Street, Port Chalmers, and known as "Futomaki Filipino - Japanese Bar, Grill & Restaurant", to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

**CONDITIONS**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:  
**Monday to Sunday 11.00 am to 12.00 midnight**
- (c) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
  - (i) A range of food choices must be readily available at all times that the premises is open. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted. A minimum of three types of food should be available. The range or style of food will be shown on any menu submitted. Alternatively, the range of food should include such items as paninis, pizzas, lasagne, toasted or fresh sandwiches, wedges, pies, filled rolls, and/or salads.
  - (ii) A range of low alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks must be readily available at all time the premises is open.
  - (iii) Water must be freely available at all times that the premises is open.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:



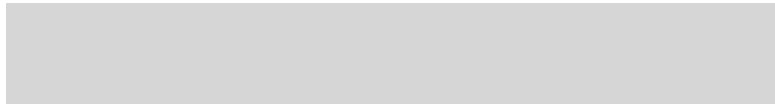

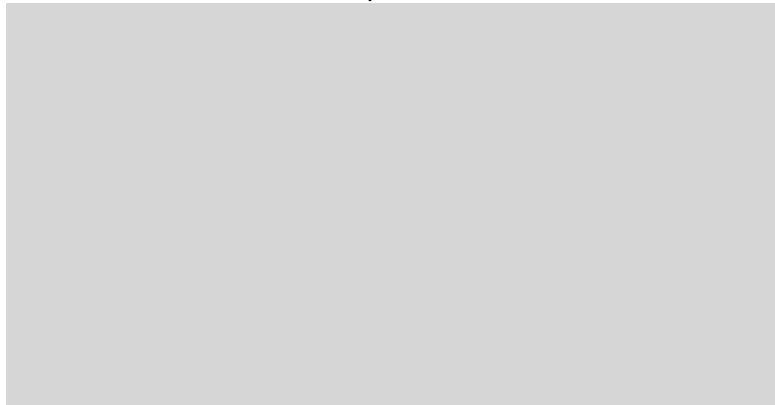

# Groups call for ORC to get on with job

LEADERS of organisations that deal with the Otago Regional Council say they want councillors to get on with the job of governing.

A meeting to determine whether Marian Hobbs should stay on as chairwoman will not be held until July 8.

Nine councillors want her removed from the role.

Ms Hobbs has said she will not stand aside before the meeting.

Representatives from a range of organisations say their focus is on getting results and the council needs to be effective and move forward.

Wise Response secretary Dugald MacTavish said yesterday the council had big issues it needed to grapple with and time was pressing.

"Water quality in Otago is far from satisfactory," he said.

"We want sustainable outcomes for our rivers.

"It seemed as if the council was getting on and trying to

address those."

Federated Farmers Otago president Simon Davies said governance at the council was lacking.

He was not greatly interested in who chaired the council but said it should be Otago-led and the leader should "follow the views of the majority".

Mr Davies said accusations from Ms Hobbs against Federated Farmers were unhelpful when the organisation had showed it wanted to be part of practical solutions.

Otago Fish & Game chief executive Ian Hadland said it was crucial the council maintained its focus on sorting out water permits.

Ms Hobbs' efforts in working with the wider Otago community had been noticed.

"Under her leadership, the council had finally started to address systemic policy failings that had been ignored for years," he said.

A spokesman for Environment Minister David Parker said he

was sufficiently concerned about the Otago Regional Council last year to appoint Judge Peter Skelton to look into whether it was adequately carrying out its duties concerning freshwater management and allocation of resources.

However, Ms Hobbs' suggestion this year that Mr Parker might bring in a commissioner for Otago was a major factor leading to the call for her to be removed as chairwoman.

She has been criticised for being too allied to the Government's agenda.

Former deputy chairwoman Gretchen Robertson issued a statement yesterday, arguing councillors were not at war.

"We must pull together and get on with implementing key work for the good of our environment and people," the statement read.

"Sustained change doesn't happen unless people want to change and see the value in doing so.

"We all care about Marian but it's not about us individually or about taking sides." — Additional reporting by Molly Houseman

# Agnew St student party plans up in the air

PLANS for a notorious student street party in Dunedin may have hit a road block.

Safety concerns about the Agnew St party have left residents unsure whether thousands of students will grace their front yards this year.

Earlier this year, documents released to student magazine *Critic* showed emergency services were concerned about the party, usually held in early August, going ahead.

Students then called on the Otago University Students' Association to get involved in the planning of the event.

President Jack Manning said 48.7% of people who responded to a referendum asking if OUSA should investigate co-hosting the event with Agnew St residents said yes. The matter would be discussed at an upcoming meeting.

"As with any street party, the safety of students [is the main concern]."

He said OUSA provided regular events, both at Starters Bar and as part of campaigns such as Ori and Re-Ori, as well

as being involved in initiatives like the Good One party registration service, but had no association with the planning of the Agnew St event.

It also ran the Hyde St party, which used to be organised by

residents, in the same vein as the less formal Agnew St party.

Agnew St resident Isabella Copinga said as far as she knew, the party plans were on hold.

Another, Yashna Shetty (21), said the last residents' meeting

was before lockdown.

She believed the resident who had taken charge of the planning was in contact with the University of Otago proctor, and the possibility of an alcohol ban had been mentioned.

She was happy for the event to go ahead, but would like further safety measures taken.

The party organiser could not be reached for comment.

Last year, there was a heavy police presence in the area for the party, and about 17 people who had been at the party needed treatment at Dunedin Hospital's emergency department for injuries and intoxication.

A University of Otago spokesman said the Agnew St party was not supported by the university, but it had encouraged the organisers to contact the Dunedin City Council and emergency services to discuss the event.

Senior Sergeant Craig Dinnissen said police declined to comment on the party at this stage.

### PROPOSED STORMWATER QUALITY BYLAW AND TRADE WASTE BYLAW REVIEW

Dunedin City Council is proposing changes to Dunedin's rules for trade waste discharged into the wastewater system and for the quality of discharges into the stormwater system.

The Trade Waste Bylaw 2008 has been reviewed and two new bylaws are being created as a result: The proposed Trade Waste Bylaw 2020 and the proposed Stormwater Quality Bylaw 2020.

Key changes/proposals in the Trade Waste Bylaw include:

- Clarifying, simplifying and updating the provisions of the bylaw.
- Additional provisions requiring pre-treatment for specified activities.
- A requirement to hold a trade waste consent for the disposal of tankered waste.
- Changes to some permitted trade waste maximum characteristic limits.

Key changes/proposals in the Stormwater Quality Bylaw include:

- Clarifying the types of contaminants that would not meet stormwater performance standards and therefore should not be discharged to the stormwater system.
- Provision of examples of pre-treatment that may be appropriate for some discharges.
- Strengthened provisions on monitoring, enforcement and offences.

## Midwife no longer allowed to practise

The rights she failed to meet were to provide services to the woman with reasonable care and skill that complied with legal, professional, ethical, and other relevant standards.

She should also have ensured quality and continuity of services and provided the woman with an acceptable level of information.

The tribunal's report was released late last month.

In a second case the woman's baby was born on April 7, 2015, after a 12-hour labour.

About an hour later, the midwife decided the woman would need to be transferred to Dunedin Hospital for suturing for a perineal tear.

Early the next morning, an emergency department doctor at Lakes District Hospital told the mother her baby may have been starved of oxygen at birth and was having seizures.

The midwife accepted she failed the mother and child on 15 counts.

They included failing to use the recommended method of measuring the baby's height, failing to discuss a possible transfer to another hospital,

failing to recognise the labour was not progressing normally and that consultation with an obstetrician was warranted, sending the woman home for four hours while she was in active labour, failing to document discussions or recommendations with the woman during labour, failing to try recommended manoeuvres to help the delivery, failing to document post-delivery care to the mother, and failing to complete an adequate formal handover of care of the mother to Dunedin Hospital.

The mother has suffered from depression and inconvenience issues since the birth.

The Government would legislate for any of the recommendations it chose to adopt after the election, if re-elected.

Ms Simpson's report was particularly critical of DHB leadership, saying that it "needs to change" and the effectiveness of elected board members was "not compelling".

She also proposed that a new agency, Health NZ, be set up which would run the ruler over DHBs' financial matters.

The majority of New Zealand's DHBs have reported deficits for quarter after quarter and are expected to remain in the red for the foreseeable future.

According to the 2020 Budget, the Treasury is expecting DHB deficits of \$1 billion a year, for the next four years.

Dr Clark said the changes to the healthcare system — as proposed by Ms Simpson — would help stem the fiscal

bleeding.

A specific Maori health authority would be the principal adviser on Maori health issues, as well as taking the lead in strengthening the Maori workforce in the health sector around the country.

The reaction to the report and its recommendation has been largely positive.

University of Otago commerce pro-vice-chancellor Robin Gauld believed it would be more useful to bring the timeframe forward.

"I think if the Government is re-elected, they would do well to get legislation in place almost immediately, post election.

"Five years is a very long time to be talking about reforming a system," Prof Gauld said.

"I don't think anyone is going to be saying this is all wrong and no-one wants change.

"They want to see some action and just get on with it." He also believed it was a

good opportunity to sort out the IT issues in the health system.

"I think there's a good set of ideas in there, but there needs to be a bit more boldness to it all."

Council of Trade Unions president Richard Wagstaff said the report had shone a clear light on some challenges that the public health system needed to address.

Victoria University of Wellington senior health policy lecturer Anna Matheson said the report was "heartening" but there were still issues within the health sector.

"We have still not addressed institutional racism, and we have not done well in tackling the social determinants of health, such as liveable incomes and healthy housing."

Dr Clark admitted that there was institutional racism in New Zealand's healthcare sector, but a Maori health authority would help fix that issue. — *The New Zealand Herald*

# Antarctic work put on ice over virus worries

AUCKLAND: The Covid-19 crisis has disrupted New Zealand science at the bottom of the planet, and Antarctica New Zealand announced yesterday it was effectively suspending deep-field research next season.

Instead, the Crown entity will be tightly restricting who it supports on the ice, limiting activity to long-term science monitoring around Scott Base, along with essential operations and planned maintenance.

Each summer season, Antarctica New Zealand hosts dozens of researchers carrying out critical research about our changing planet, along with base staff and New Zealand Defence Force personnel.

The organisation had begun planning last October for 36 groups or "events" under its normal \$30 million budget, but 23



of those had now been postponed.

Asked if those suspended events would be prioritised for the next available season, a spokesman said each would be reassessed on a case-by-case basis, "and we are in close contact with each event manager".

"Planning for the next season begins in October."

The decision, announced yesterday afternoon, came after close consultation with other countries' programmes being run in the Ross Sea region.

It is also likely research sup-

ported by the US National Science Foundation out of McMurdo Station — a short drive from the New Zealand outpost on Ross Island — will be disrupted by the pandemic.

Antarctica New Zealand chief executive Sarah Williamson said the key to keeping Scott Base virus-free was a limit on the number of people travelling to Antarctica and a strict managed isolation plan.

"Antarctica New Zealand is committed to maintaining and enhancing the quality of New Zealand's Antarctic scientific research," she said.

"However, current circumstances dictate that our ability to support science is extremely limited this season."

Priority engineering projects were still planned to go ahead, as was some work as part of Scott Base's rebuild.

Operations general manager

Simon Trotter said the call had been a difficult one.

"We acknowledge the impact this Covid-19 response will have on research this season, but these are unprecedented times," he said.

Among those scientists affected were several Niwa researchers, including marine physicist Natalie Robinson.

Dr Robinson was hopeful her work, focused on how ice shelves would melt as the ocean warmed, could be moved back a year.

As it was part of a seven-year programme, it was possible to "absorb a delay and still deliver within the timeframe".

The restrictions were in line with other international programmes' decisions, she said.

"You can't do anything other than support the international efforts to keep the continent Covid-free." — The New Zealand Herald

## 'We have really had our mettle tested'

UNIVERSITY of Otago vice-chancellor Harlene Hayne has described dealing with fallout from the Covid-19 pandemic as an emotional rollercoaster.

"We have really had our mettle tested here," Prof Hayne told the university's council yesterday.

"It has been an incredible emotional rollercoaster."

Prof Hayne paid tribute to people who helped the university get through the lockdown and its aftermath and became emotional when thanking chief operating officer Stephen Willis.

"There is no way that we would have survived with Steve," she said.

"His discipline, organisation and good humour set us up for what we had to face."

Critical services were taken off-site during lockdown.

Prof Hayne said Mr Willis got the job done while parenting four children and while his wife worked as a nurse.

"He led us with a toddler on his shoulder."

Prof Hayne said the leadership team decided early to provide necessary support for staff and students, including pastoral care.

"Very early in the piece, we set our moral compass." AskOtago was one service

that needed a boost to enable it to respond to an increased number of queries.

The university also confirmed yesterday that three more graduation ceremonies would probably be needed this year, after May's four ceremonies were cancelled.

More than 1000 graduates and graduands who missed public graduation ceremonies in May have indicated they want to take part in person.

The university has signalled an additional ceremony could take place on August 15.

Two more could be held in late November or early December.

## Reprimand for 'knitting' comment

WELLINGTON: National MP Paul Goldsmith has been reprimanded by deputy leader Nikki Kaye for saying Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern should "stick to her knitting".

Mr Goldsmith made the comment when responding to Ms Ardern saying she was "angry" about the Warehouse's move to lay off more than 1000 staff.

"I don't think it's helpful for the Prime Minister to be criticising struggling businesses. She should stick to her knitting," Mr Goldsmith said.

The phrase prompted a backlash on social media and it is understood Mr Goldsmith was reprimanded by Ms Kaye for using it.

He has since conceded it was not the best choice of words because younger people, including his own children, did not understand the metaphor.

He told RNZ it was a phrase he used often and he meant no disrespect to the Prime Minister by it.

Asked if he was apologising, he said: "I can do. She's pretty tough."

"I'm sure she's not in the least bit worried about it... We're in a robust political environment."

He said he would just as readily have directed it to Finance Minister Grant Robertson.

In fact, Mr Goldsmith has used the same phrase before towards NZ First MP Shane Jones in Parliament.

"I use the phrase all the time. The point of it is to say: 'Stick to your task rather than meddling in somebody else's.'"

"It is not for politicians to determine what business decisions should be made in terms of a private company trying to stay afloat at a difficult time."

"The Prime Minister's focus should be on clearly articulating a credible growth plan to get us back on track as a country."

"What we're seeing at the moment is a plan that consists of debt-fuelled government spending on a colossal scale and waiting for a vaccine."

"We need to do better than that."

He told RNZ the wage subsidy and its extension made sense, but the country needed to focus on private investment, business confidence, and international students, rather than more restrictions on overseas investment. — The New Zealand Herald

## Anti-vax sentiment grows due to 'misinfodemic'

WELLINGTON: Anti-vax sentiment is becoming more entrenched among nearly a third of New Zealanders — a worrying trend one leading scientist has blamed on a social media-driven "misinfodemic".

The findings, published by University of Auckland researchers, come from the first longitudinal survey to track Kiwis' attitudes to vaccination over time.

While 60% of those surveyed remained highly confident vaccines were safe, the study also found 30% were growing more sceptical.

The paper — using data from the 20-year New Zealand Attitudes and Values Study, which regularly polls more than 18,000 Kiwis on various topics — looked at perceptions on

vaccination between 2013 and 2017.

"The data did show a quite high number — 30% — of people who are less supportive of vaccination now than they were five years ago and the danger is that trend will continue," lead author Carol Lee said.

Survey participants were asked how strongly they agreed or disagreed with the statement "It is safe to vaccinate children following the standard NZ immunisation schedule" on a scale of one to seven, with seven denoting strong agreement.

Respondents split on the vaccination question fell into distinct groups.

"Believers" made up 60% of the total, while "sceptics" made up 30% and were generally at less than five on the scale, also showing a falling

level of agreement over time.

Another 10% had become more positive about vaccination in the past five years.

Europeans, men, those from

richer areas and those with a higher education level were more likely to be "believers".

Older individuals, women, and those with a lower level of education were more likely to be vaccine sceptics.

The Immunisation Advisory Centre's director, Assoc Prof

Nikki Turner, said there was still mixed evidence on which groups were more likely to oppose vaccination.

Studies had pointed to wealthier and highly educated people who did not hold science degrees but also to poorer, less-educated people distrustful of the Government and health officials.

The issue had been amplified by platforms such as Facebook, where sceptics could share misinformation widely without being challenged.

Coverage tables still showed 89% of 5-year-olds were fully immunised for their age, along with 92% of 1-year-olds.

Still, Turner said, anti-vaccination sentiment remained a "huge challenge" here and overseas.

"We are living in an age of the misinfodemic, where information flows abundantly

but not all of it is true," Associate Prof Helen Petousis-Harris, a vaccinologist at the University of Auckland, said.

"Some information is deliberately manufactured into dangerous conspiracy theories. We are seeing polarisation on many issues all over the world and it is both disturbing and dangerous."

She saw a twofold solution to the problem.

"First, ensure people leave school with a basic understanding of logic and how the scientific method works so they can safely navigate the deluge of information."

Second, health authorities could keep better track of people's concerns online and keep them informed with honest, transparent messages.

"Don't leave a void to be filled by misinformation and conspiracy theories."

"I think when we talk about participatory democracy, we've got to be careful about how we make these groups up," Cr Jim O'Malley said.

Cr Chris Staines said he believed the terms of reference for the group as proposed by council staff were

"only going to produce greater anger amongst the retailers".

"If you look at the list of people represented, retailers' representation is by far the minority and I accept that we want to get a cross-section of our community, but I think the initial reaction if we were to go ahead with this at this

stage would be a very negative one again — and I think we need to think this out a little bit more," he said.

Mayor Aaron Hawkins said he found it "remarkable" that councillors wanted to defer a public debate this week on the terms of reference and membership of the group. He also questioned the

"calibre of debate" that would follow a non-public workshop, his colleagues called for to ensure staff had got the basics of the group's membership and terms of reference right.

The work to progress plans for George St would not stop while the group was formed, he said.

"It's not going to filibuster the George St work."

Mr Hawkins and Crs David Benson-Pope, Christine Carey, Marie Laifso, and Steve Walker voted against the delay.

The council will revisit the issue of the formation of the group on June 30.

All deaths in the neonatal intensive care unit were now also referred to the coroner.

"I would like to pass on our sincere condolences on the death and loss of [Baby B] and apologise unreservedly for the inadequate care which both [the mother] and [the baby]

received," SDHB chief executive Chris Fleming told Ms Wall.

"I would also like to thank the family and the HDC for raising concerns about the care of [mother and baby] with us, as this helps us to reflect on the care provided, and also on how we can improve the service we deliver in the future to

our mothers and children."

Ms Wall said multiple DHB clinicians cared for the baby, but their work was "suboptimal in a number of respects".

Overall, their failings were the responsibility of the SDHB, although it was not possible or appropriate for her to say if any led to the baby's death.

"In my opinion, multiple

aspects of the care provided to [the mother] by SDHB fall short of acceptable standards," Ms Wall said.

"Notwithstanding the personal responsibilities of the individual providers in her care, communication issues, which I consider were SDHB's responsibility, led to confusion about who was taking responsi-

bility for [the mother's] care."

The doctor who gave the incorrect injection had apologised to the family.

He acknowledged the error, which he said happened in "a highly pressured and emergency situation, which required urgent/immediate action".

The mother's Lead Maternity Care midwife was ordered to

apologise to the family and the Midwifery Council asked to consider if a further review of her competency was needed.

Ms Wall noted changes the SDHB had implemented following her provisional opinion, and recommended it advise her of progress within three months.
