DECISION OF THE DUNEDIN DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

In accordance with section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 this application has been considered under delegated authority.

DECISION

This is an application by Dunedin Clay Target Club Incorporated for the renewal of an alcohol club licence in respect of their premises situated at 395 Brighton Road, Green Island, and known as the "Dunedin Clay Target Club".

The application is for a roll-over of the present conditions.

The application was duly advertised, and one objection was received but the person does not wish to be heard. It was from a concerned member of the public and related to the access to firearms while consuming alcohol. The Committee acknowledges this is a matter of concern however, the objection was not valid. The objector did not demonstrate an interest greater than the public generally and it did not relate to the section 105 criteria to which the Committee must have regard.

The reporting agencies, the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Licensing Inspector, did not oppose the grant of the licence. The Police commented that:

- The club has successfully submitted renewal applications in the past without issue
- While the Police does not condone the use of firearms while under the influence of intoxicating substances, they are satisfied with the applicant's Host Responsibility Policies and how the club operates
- They are satisfied the club adheres to the rules around the safe use of firearms
- They work closely with the club to ensure the highest standards of practice and safety are met.

Accordingly, we deal with the matter on the papers.

The criteria the Committee must have regard to are found at section 105 of the Act.

a) The object of the Act – there is no evidence presented that suggests the object of the Act is not being met

- b) Suitability of the applicant this is not contested
- c) Relevant Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) the application falls within the parameters of the policy
- d) The days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol they are within the maximum days/hours set in the LAP
- e) Design and layout of the premises not an issue
- f) Whether the applicant is engaged in, or proses to be engaged in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments and food not applicable
- g) Whether the applicant is engaged in, or proses to be engaged in, the provision of services other than those related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments and food not applicable
- h) Amenity and good order of the locality the premises is some distance from any other site therefore this is not an issue
- i) Amenity and good order of the locality is already affected, and the renewal will further reduce the effects not applicable
- j) The applicant has the appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law this is not raised as an issue.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and therefore renew the licence until 20 April 2024, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the most recent date of expiry and authorise the issue of a replacement licence and notice of renewal.

- Additional signage and/or shelving will be installed to reduce exposure of alcohol displays from outside the single alcohol area.


As the matters were 'minor' and resolution achieved at the meeting we will deal with the matter on the papers.

The Licensing Inspector advises that there are no issues of concern raised in the time they have been operating the premises other than the toilet facilities.

The Committee is satisfied that the applicant will continue to operate the premises properly and therefore issues another order authorising the applicant to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol, under the same conditions as were granted initially, for a further period of three months from 9 June 2021.
