DECISION OF THE DUNEDIN DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

In accordance with section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 this application has been considered under delegated authority.

DECISION

This is an application by No8 Fine Spirits Limited for an off-licence in respect of the premises situated at 90 Bond Street, Dunedin, and known as the “No8 Distillery”. The applicant also seeks a s.40 endorsement to allow remote sales and deliveries.

The application is in respect of a premises that has not previously been licensed. The principal business is the sale of alcohol.

The application was duly advertised and one objection was received. The objector did not wish to be heard and related more to the on-licence that is also sought by the applicant. The reporting agencies, Police, Medical Officer of Health and Licensing Inspector, have not opposed the grant of the licence. Accordingly, we deal with the matter on the papers.

The premises is in Warehouse Precinct Zone of Dunedin but there is some residential activity. There has not been a licensed premises at this location and the applicant is selling their own product along with a small selection of other New Zealand made spirits. It will not operate as a typical bottle store.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and we grant the applicant an off-licence authorising the sale and supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises and to operate as a remote seller.

The applicant’s attention is drawn to ss.56 and 57(a) of the Act obliging the holder of an off-licence to display: -

1. A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be easily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; AND,
2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance; AND,
3. A sign prominently displayed inside the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.

Remote have different requirements to other premises. The first is a response to the fact the buyer is not confronted at the time of purchase and to this end, regulation 14 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulations 2013 details the requirements imposed on licensees to ensure prohibited people do not purchase alcohol. This regulation is reproduced here for clarity:

14 Reasonable steps to verify that people not under purchase age

(1) The procedures described in subclauses (2) to (4) are reasonable procedures for the purposes of complying with [section 59\(3\)](#) of the Act (which requires the holder of an off-licence to take reasonable steps to verify that the buyer of any alcohol that the holder sells by remote sale (and, if a person other than the buyer is to receive it, to verify that the receiver) is not under the purchase age).

(2) In the case of an order made using an internet site, the procedure is to—

- (a) ask the prospective buyer to declare, by ticking an on-screen box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)—*
 - (i) once when the prospective buyer first enters the internet site; and*
 - (ii) again, immediately before the sale of any alcohol is completed; and*
- (b) refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless, on both occasions, he or she declares that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, also declares that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over).*

(3) In the case of a telephone order, the procedure is to—

- (a) ask the prospective buyer to declare, orally, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)—*
 - (i) once when the conversation concerned begins; and*
 - (ii) again, immediately before the conversation is completed; and*
- (a) refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless, on both occasions, he or she declares that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, also declares that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over).*

(4) In the case of an order made on a physical order form, the procedure is to—

- (a) ensure that the form—*
 - (i) requires the prospective buyer to sign the form at a place at or near its end; and*
 - (ii) contains 2 requests for the prospective buyer to declare, by ticking a box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and, where a prospective receiver is involved, that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over)—*
 - (A) one at the beginning of the form; and*
 - (B) the other, immediately before the place on the form where the prospective buyer is required to sign it; and*
- (b) refuse to sell alcohol to the prospective buyer unless he or she has ticked both boxes and signed the form.*

Regulation 15 describes the information to be provided by remote sellers. When using an internet website the licence holder must display prominently on the website, any catalogue produced and every receipt issued for alcohol sold remotely:

- (a) The licence holder's name and licence number*
- (b) The date the licence expires.*

- (c) And in addition to this either a legible image of the licence, or a clearly identified link to such image, must be clearly displayed on the website.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Premises:

Monday to Sunday 10.00 am to 10.00 pm

Remote:

Orders may be taken at any time on any day

Deliveries may be made Monday to Sunday, 6.00 am to 11.00 pm

- (c) While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at the place where the samples are being supplied.
- (d) The whole of the premises is designated a supervised area.
- (e) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of on sales to intoxicated persons.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance(s) to the premises as outlined in the plan received by the Dunedin District Licensing Committee on 1 March 2023
The entrance from Bond Street is designated as the principal entrance.

In accordance with section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 this application has been considered under delegated authority.

DECISION

This is an application by AND Hospitality Group Limited for the inclusion of a caterer's endorsement on their current on-licence in terms of s.38 of the Act (caterer).

This endorsement would allow the applicant to deliver alcohol from the premises situated at 21 The Octagon, Dunedin, and known as "Vault 21", and to sell it on any other premises for consumption on those premises by people attending any reception, function or other social gathering promoted by any person or association of persons other than the applicant.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and we grant the applicant a s.38 caterer's endorsement on their current on-licence for the purposes of allowing them to cater for functions away from their premises.

The sections 56 and 57(a) of the Act obliging the holder of an on-licence to display a copy of the licence does not apply to the holder of an on-licence endorsed pursuant to s.38 of the Act. However, it would be prudent to have available a copy of the licence should anyone seek the authority by which the alcohol is being sold and/or supplied.

CONDITIONS

The caterer's endorsed licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on any premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may be delivered from the premises specified in the licence and sold on any other premises only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 8.00 am to 3.00 am the following day

to persons attending any reception, function or other social gathering promoted by any person or association of persons other than the holder of this licence.

- (c) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises in which the alcohol is being sold and/or supplied –
 - (i) A reasonable range non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages; and
 - (ii) Water must be freely available at all times: and
 - (iii) Food appropriate to the particular function or gathering being catered for.
- (d) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- (e) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.
- (f) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the premises in which alcohol is being sold and/or supplied detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be available to be displayed, if requested, at the location at which the reception, function or other social gathering is being held.
