COASTAL PERMIT

Pursuant to Section 104B of the Resource Management Act 1991, the Otago Regional Council grants consent to:

Name: Dunedin City Council

Address: Civic Centre, 50 the Octagon Dunedin

To discharge wastewater to the Otago Harbour at Sawyers Bay for the purpose of managing the wastewater network

For a term expiring 1 January 2042

Location of consent activity: Otago Harbour, approximately 140 metres south east of the intersection of Station Road and State Highway 88, Dunedin

Legal description of consent location: Common Marine and Coastal Area

Conditions

Specific

1. The consent holder shall install and maintain a flow monitor at the overflow to record the period of discharge and discharge rate. The flow monitor shall be downloaded at not more than monthly intervals.
2. The consent holder shall provide information to the public on the overflows and associated risks, and ongoing progress for their prevention, through its website and other means.
3. The consent holder shall erect a sign at the end of the outfall pipe that reads *"Health warning: wastewater overflows may occur from this outfall during heavy rainfall. Contact with water is not recommended. Due to the risk of contamination, the taking of shellfish for human consumption is not recommended at any time."*
4. The consent holder shall clean up any litter resulting from the overflows, within 24 hours of the litter being discovered.

5. (a) The consent holder shall facilitate the establishment of a Stakeholder Group within one year of the granting of this consent. As a minimum, the following organisations shall be invited to nominate a representative on the Stakeholder Group: Southern District Health Board, the Department of Conservation, Te Runanga o Otakou, Kaikorai College and Port Otago.
- (b) The consent holder shall communicate the results of monitoring under condition 1 to the Stakeholder Group annually.
- (c) The consent holder shall invite members of the Stakeholder Group to a meeting at least once every five years. The purpose of the meeting shall be to discuss the results of monitoring and report progress in the renewals programme to prevent overflows.

Performance Monitoring

6. The consent holder shall provide a written report on its performance under the conditions of this consent to the Consent Authority by 31 October each year. The report shall include, but not limited to:
- (a) A summary of results recorded under condition 1;
- (b) Evidence of measures undertaken for public awareness, including the precise location of the warning signs; and
- (c) Minutes of any meetings held with the Stakeholder Group.

General

7. The discharge, after reasonable mixing, shall not give rise to all or any of the following effects in the receiving water:
- (a) The production of any conspicuous oil or grease films, scums or foams, or floatable or suspended materials; or
- (b) Any conspicuous change in the colour or visual clarity; or
- (c) Any emission of objectionable odour; or
- (d) Any significant adverse effects on aquatic life.

Review

8. The Consent Authority may, in accordance with Sections 128 and 129 of the Resource Management Act 1991, serve notice on the consent holder of its intention to review the conditions of this consent within three months of each anniversary of the commencement of this consent for the purpose of:
- (a) determining whether the conditions of this consent are adequate to deal with any adverse effect on the environment which may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage;
- (b) ensuring the conditions of this consent are consistent with any National Environmental Standards, Regulations, relevant plans and/or the Otago Regional Policy Statement.
